FAITH AND MISSION NEWS

YEAR OF MERCY December 8 2015 – November 13 2016

Theme: “Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful”

Last Saturday, 12 staff attended the launch of the Year of Mercy at the Catholic Leadership Centre with approximately 400 people from Catholic schools and parishes in the Archdiocese. Throughout the day, we were immersed in God's mercy through challenging thoughts, Scripture, prayer, music and most importantly, the joy of living the Gospel through the kindness of people around us.

We learned that mercy is heavily weighted towards love and compassion; mercy is not an emotion; it is a choice and a decision: we choose to be merciful, to do the more loving thing even in trying circumstances. We draw closer to God through acts of mercy. Above all, mercy is contagious. We were challenged by inspirational speakers to show ‘God in us’ to people in our surroundings.

The Archdiocese has planned a number of events for the year of Mercy including the opening of a ‘Door of Mercy’ at St Patrick's Cathedral in Melbourne through which anyone who enters will symbolically experience the love of God who consoles, pardons and instils hope.

Some staff reflected on their experiences:

“The Jubilee Year of Mercy is an opportunity to join together as a Catholic community and be a witness to mercy, ‘Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.’” (Luke 6: 36)

“We gained useful insight into the lives of the residents in Heidelberg West and the huge impact the Exodus community has had on their daily lives. It was amazing to hear how the residents have immersed themselves in their faith and how they have used this to create opportunities for disadvantaged people in their area.”

“‘Our spiritual quest is often like trying to take a close-up photo of the horizon.’ These words from workshop presenter and keynote speaker, Margaret Silf really resonated with me.”

Italian Trip

This year 11 students, Jordan Gualano, Emma Wardell, Natalie Soligo, John Grasso, Ysabel Dungca, Julia Cavasinni, Olivia Mack, Breanna Dimitrievski, Tonia Ciccone, Joshua Ibrahim and Michael Cappola and two staff, Mrs Roberts and Ms Daniele, travelled to Italy on Marymede's fifth International Study Tour.

Our purpose was to collaborate with one of our College's Italian sister schools, Liceo Pico, located in a town named Mirandola in the Emilia Romagna region, to enhance our student's Italian language and knowledge of Italian art, architecture and artists whilst focusing on a project entitled 'Art From Italy' with the Liceo Pico students.

Our student's language and artistic skills were broadened as well as their independence and maturity as they stepped out of their comfort zones and everyday life into one of unfamiliarity. The many sightseeing tours which took us to Florence, Venice, Verona, Modena, Rome, Lake Garda, Bologna, the Juventus stadium and museum, Enzo Ferrari's museum, the Balsamic Vinegar manufacturing plant and Parmigiano Reggiano. School visits and host family experiences worked together to gift our students with what one described as "the best experience in my life so far".

A speech read at our farewell party in Mirandola to host families, students and staff of Liceo Pico by our Deputy Principal Mrs Roberts encapsulated the 2015 Marymede Study Tour and excerpts are below:

"Our journey has been an experience of discovery and curiosity, connecting two nations through language, art and most importantly, relationships..."

For experiences and information to be integrated into our lives as true awareness, they have to be received with open hands, inquisitive minds and wondering hearts...

Together, we have travelled a journey that required being vulnerable, stepping out of our comfort zone...What we have learnt is that being vulnerable is a strength, being prepared to be inquisitive and curious about our journey has left us with a deeper understanding of life in Italy and in particular Mirandola.

To our Italian colleagues, host families and the Italian students, we say a huge thanks for your generous hospitality and kindness as you have embraced the students, Ms. Daniele and myself into your families.

Our special thanks to Mr Siena and Marina Marchi for inviting us to share this intercultural experience, and particularly for the many, many hours of work behind the scenes.

Education today is about inspiring our students to cultivate curiosity and we must continue to instil a love of learning in our students and children to become creative, analytical and reflective thinkers, young men and women who strive to make a difference in the world.

Your school is a vibrant place of learning that reaches out to the world providing authentic learning experiences for your students. We look forward to emulating the many contemporary programs we have encountered during our visit.

Finally, I thank Maria Daniele for having the foresight many years ago at Marymede to pursue an intercultural exchange experience for our students to connect them to a wider world of discovery outside the boundaries of South Morang

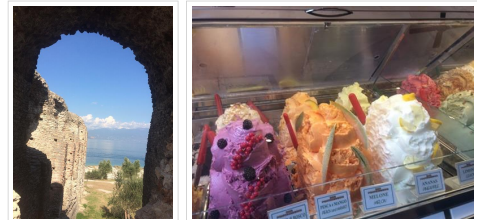
We will always treasure our times together in Mirandola with heartfelt memories."

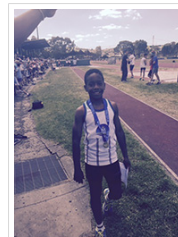
