### School Improvement Survey Results

The College recently received the results of our 2017 School Improvement Surveys. We had a record number of families respond to the survey – 158 families, alongside, 339 students and 128 staff – which has provided some outstanding insights into the progress the College has made in the past 12 months.

The results of the survey have been very affirming of the direction the College is taking and the changes underway. It also continues to give us important information on how to continue to grow and develop over the next 5 years.

### Year 11 and 12 Commencement

Our Year 10 and 11 students officially became Year 11 and 12 students today with the beginning of their 2018 Commencement classes. These classes are an important introduction to their VCE studies and ensure they have a jump start to their studies next year. 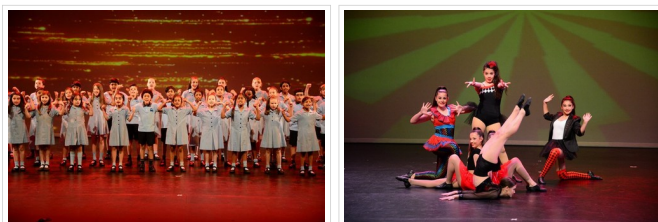
### Marymede Catholic College *Top Acts Performing Arts Concert- A raging Success*

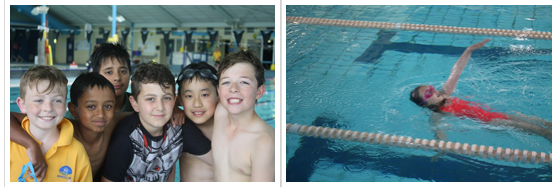
