DEPUTY PRINCIPAL LEARNING AND TEACHING NEWS PREP – YEAR 12

NAPLAN

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will sit the annual NAPLAN tests on May 9-11.

The NAPLAN results provide the College and families with useful information about students' progress in literacy and numeracy. However, it is also essential to remember that NAPLAN is just one set of tests in one week and cannot be considered in isolation. Teachers use a range of data to measure student achievement and NAPLAN should not cause students anxiety. Students should aim to apply themselves to the tests but, at the same time, keep in mind that their abilities, skills and intelligence are much broader than can be measured by NAPLAN.

As a school, Marymede does not aim to prepare students for NAPLAN specifically. We seek to provide students with personalised and challenging literacy and numeracy programs in line with the Victorian Curriculum. We will spend a small amount of time familiarizing students in Year 3, 5 and 7 with the format of the tests to ensure that the experience is not overwhelming or difficult and that they understand how to respond to the types of questions they will encounter.

If you have any concerns about the upcoming NAPLAN tests, please contact your child's pastoral teacher or myself.

Examinations

For our Year 9 - 12 students, Term 2 is the study and examination term. From June 13 to 16, our Year 9 - 11 students will undertake their Semester 1 examinations and, while potentially stressful, starting to study now will assist students in feeling confident and prepared to perform at their best. Student in Years 9-11 this week will receive their examination timetable in early May and key information about semester examinations to assist them in starting to study and prepare for these upcoming assessments.

In the final year of VCE, the October-November examinations make up 50% of a students' final score in a subject and has some influence over their marks in school-assessed assessments, too. Becoming successful at examinations is a skill that is developed and mastered over time. As a result, it is essential for students to practice their examination and study skills in Years 9-11, to ensure that by the time they reach Year 12 they possess excellent study skills and a proficient approach to exam in order to fulfil their potential.

Given this, students' results in their Year 10 & 11 examinations are a key factor in approving their subject choices for next year, when subject selection commences in Term 3. Students will only be guaranteed approval in their selected studies in 2018 if they have achieved a minimum of 60% in the examination of the related study or studies in Semester 1 2017. Students should also be aware that they must achieve a minimum of 50% in both their English and Religious Education examinations in order to be approved to commence or continue in VCE.

Students who struggle to achieve a satisfactory result will have the opportunity to resit examinations on school on Tuesday July 4 (the first Tuesday of the Term 2 holidays) and, while the original mark will appear on semester reports, the resit mark will be considered in the subject selection process.

For Year 12 students and Year 11 students completing accelerated studies, their first set of trial examinations will take place from July 4-7. These exams have been scheduled during the first week of the term break in order to ensure the best opportunity for students to test their knowledge of the Unit 3 content without missing out on valuable class time. These trial examinations are compulsory for all students completing scored assessment.

New in 2017 - Specialisation in Year 3 and 4

This year, Year 3 and 4 teachers have taken on the challenge of specialising in an aspect of the curriculum in order to further deepen the learning of our students in their middle-primary years. The 'specialising' teacher then takes each of the grades in their year level for two periods a fortnight for focused learning, enabling all classes, access to deep learning and a consistent experience in the Domains of Science, Technology, Social & Emotional Learning, and Health & Physical Education. While these areas of the curriculum are also integrated through the students' core studies with their classroom teachers, these specialist periods allow for a focused study in these key areas. This initiative has also enabled ongoing professional learning as

well as tapping the hidden passions of many of our primary teachers.

We are on the hunt for a Backstage Crew of students from Year 5 – Year 9, who would like to assist backstage with Seussical Jr.


