Dear Parents, Staff, Students and Friends of our Marymede Community,

Yesterday, our students and staff gathered in their Secondary House Groups and Primary Year Levels for an Ash Wednesday Liturgy. Our foreheads were marked with ashes reminding us of our Lenten task of finding time to reflect on how we can be better people and do more for others.

## DEPUTY PRINCIPAL LEARNING AND TEACHING NEWS PREP – YEAR 12

### Information Evenings

Thank you to the Year 10 and Year 11 parents who attended our recent VCE/VCAL Information Evening earlier this week. Next Tuesday, the Year 12 Parent Information Evening will be held in the Auditorium from 7pm and will provide parents with key information to assist them to support their sons and daughters through this final – challenging – year of secondary schooling. It would be great to see all Year 12 parents on the night.

We also look forward to seeing our Year 7 parents next Monday in the Fitness Centre from 7pm at our Year 7 Camp and House Parent Evening. During this important evening, the Outdoor Education Group (OEG) will present key information about the upcoming camp – March 21-23 – and House Coordinators are looking forward to touching base with families about the Year 7s' experience in the first few weeks of secondary school.

### Required Reading

The benefits of your child establishing a habit of reading regularly cannot be overstated; the capacity to read confidently and fluently is key to learning in all areas of the curriculum and at all levels from Prep to 12 and beyond.

Making reading a shared activity with your child from an early age is a fantastic way to encourage them to read as well. Research suggests that children who read with their parents are more likely to experience academic achievement. Having regular time together with a parent one-on-one as they share a book also has wellbeing benefits for children – and hopefully, for parents too.

Whatever their age, the beginning of the year is a great time to make reading together with your child a habit. Try to read together at least 5 nights a week and along the way, try some of these strategies recommended by the Department of Education:

- Read stories or passages in short sections and encourage your child explain what happened before you continue reading.
- Ask your child questions as you read – 'I wonder why they did that?' or 'how do you think they felt when that happened?' or 'what might have happened if they didn't do that?'
- Relate the events in the book to things that have happened in your child's life – eg. 'Do you remember when we went to the beach?'

- At the end of the book, encourage your child to tell you the story in their own words.
- Discuss the words that are unfamiliar to your child and show them how to look up the meanings in a dictionary or online.
- As they get older, ask your child to tell you about what is happening in the book as if they were the main character
- Encourage them to think about why particular characters do things – for example, why did boy get knock the book off the table?
- Share the task of reading – particularly with reluctant reader; take it in turns to read a page each or a paragraph each
- Model reading with expression and enthusiasm – use different voices for different characters and change your tone and volume to reflect the character's emotion – and encourage your child to do the same.

At this stage we are seeing around 520 asylum seekers through the Foodbank each week and have found that 1/3 of these are

relying on us as their sole source of food. This is a staggering amount, but highlights the responsibility we have to our clients to ensure that enough healthy and safe food is in consistent supply until more humane immigration policies are realised by our Government.
