RMIT Urban Futures Competition

This year, we had two students shortlisted in the RMIT Urban Futures Competition. We congratulate Chelsea Harrop who was highly commended, placing her in the top 20 for Victoria. The focus of the competition was on how our students can be leaders in creating liveable, resilient and vibrant cities of the future. Considering the challenge of significant and current population growth in Melbourne, students were asked to create an image or provide a photograph that communicated an identifiable problem and an explanation of their proposed solution. Here is Chelsea's entry in the competition.



With many people still wanting to buy homes closer to inner Melbourne, there is a major crisis of a potential future where there is a scarcity of fresh produce coming from the suburban and inner-urban areas. This creates problems for communities and small businesses who depend on fresh produce to provide for their everyday lifestyle. By introducing environmentally friendly food trucks into many communities, we can start to encourage the general public to come together to support and maintain a healthy environment.

These are not normal food trucks where you buy delicious food from, but old food trucks that would now be used to grow commercial quantities of sustainable produce. These not only take up limited amount of space but are sustainable as they use LED lights to replace the sun, use recycled plastic bottles instead of soil, and only use recycled water to feed the plants. Some of the main fruits and vegetables that can be grown in these farms include tomatoes, lettuce, melons, strawberries and onions. Previously trialled in America, this method has proven to be incredibly effective. Why reinvent the wheel, when instead we could reinvigorate it? By employing and training homeless Victorians, as well as having enthusiastic citizens in communities, we would not only be growing fresh food in a sustainable manner, but we would also be helping to train more people about ensuring the future sustainability of our people.
