Grooming & Personal Presentation

It is my expectation that our students will present themselves well at all times and wear the College uniform with pride and in an acceptable manner. I ask for parental support to ensure that the high grooming standard of our College is maintained.

I would like to mention specifically:

Jewellery:

Apart from watches and a chain with a small crucifix, no other jewellery is to be worn at school. This includes bracelets, rings etc.

Body Piercings:

Students may wear one plain earring per ear in the ear lobe (no spacers or dermals). No other objects are permitted in the eyebrow, nose, lip etc.

Hair:

Extreme hair styles are not permitted. These include dreadlocks, Mohican-style cuts, extreme long or short styles (Level 3 is the minimum hair length). Hair is to be of one natural colouring.

Facial Hair:

Boys are expected to be clean shaven at all times.

Summer Uniforms Only:

Socks:

Boys – Short, blue with stripes

Girls – Short blue, plain

Girls Dresses:

Some of our female students may have grown over the holidays. I ask that you check the length of your dress before returning to school to ensure that it touches the knee.

I ask that parents and students please note that wearing of the blazer is optional in Term 1; however, the jumper does not replace the blazer to and from school.

Once again, I ask for parental assistance in these matters. I thank you for supporting us in meeting our grooming expectations.

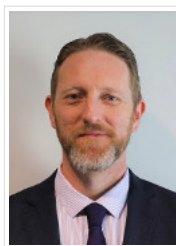
Welcome and Introduction

Class of 2019 – Results and Pathways

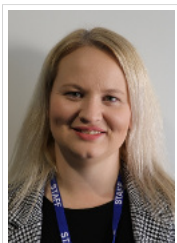
As a College we are very proud of the results of the class of 2019. Our strong VCE results of a study score median of 30 reflect the hard work and dedication of our students in collaboration with their teachers and with the support from their families. Following on from these results tertiary offers were made in December and January; 75% of the students that applied for a university place received their 1st or 2nd preference with a variety of institutions and courses selected. In addition to this we have a number of students who have sought a vocational pathway and have been offered further study opportunities at TAFE.

Australian Catholic Youth Festival – *Listen to what the spirit is saying*

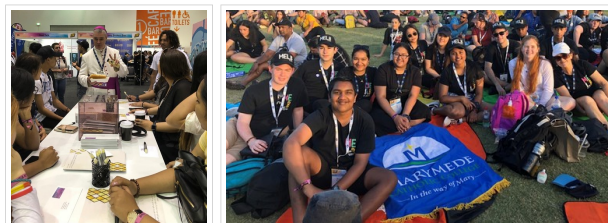
The group who attended Perth in December were treated to an amazing array of musicians, speakers, clergy and workshops focused on the Catholic Youth of today.

Key features of the Festival included:

- The Encounter Expo, with more than 80 stalls featuring Catholic agencies, organizations, religious orders, ecclesial movements and all types of Catholic groups from across Australia that offer a range of interactive and experiential activities to explore the breadth and depth of the Church's mission in Australia;
- Musical performances from local and international artists, including Australian singer-songwriters Fr Rob Galea, Gen Bryant and Josh Angrisano and US singer Joe Melendrez;
- Presentations from local and international speakers, including Katie Prejean McGrady and Grace Forrest;
- The Justice Activity Centre, a place of education, empowerment, mission, and service, with a range of interactive experiences and activities facilitated by various organizations and groups that encourage young people to engage with justice issues and people affected by injustice;

- The Experiential Prayer Room and Worship Centre, showcasing different styles of prayer, including Taize, Eucharistic Adoration, praying with icons and instructional sessions on the celebration of the mass.
