Mobile Phone Policy

Most members of the Marymede Catholic College community will be aware that all schools run by the Victorian, NSW and Western Australian Education departments have instituted state-wide policies on Mobile Phones that ban their use in schools. These state governments made this considered decision in order to both improve student engagement and as part of their Childsafe commitments to help reduce cyber-bullying and image-abuse.

At Marymede we have always discouraged the use of mobile phones as our students have ready access to the vast majority of the technology benefits through personal laptop devices and access to College banks of laptops. The College Board has recently formalised these arrangements in the 'Mobile Phone Policy', which can be read in full via this link:

In short, mobile phones are to remain in student lockers from the first to the last bell each day. The only exceptions will be where a teacher has sought permission from leadership for a specific educational use. Any parents with an urgent need to contact their child during the learning day should do so via the college email or phone so that messages can then be passed on by College staff.

Students in possession of or using their mobile phone or other smart device (such as a smart watch, fit-bit, etc) will have the device confiscated and placed in secure storage at Student Reception and may be collected after the last bell for the day. Should a student have their device confiscated a third time (or more) then the device must be collected by a parent / guardian during office hours (Mon-Thurs 8.00am - 5.00pm; Fri 8.00am - 4.30pm).

We thank-you for your continuing support of College policies and practices to support your child's learning.

Photo Day - Tuesday 3 March

A reminder to current Marymede families that School photos are scheduled to take place during the school day on Tuesday 3 March 2020 with sibling photos taking place from 3.30 – 5.00pm. In 2020, the College will use the services of National Photography who offer value packages and simplified ordering processes for our families. Students should already have brought home their personalised order forms including ordering and package details earlier this week. Should your child have misplaced their form, students may pick up a blank envelope from Student Reception.

To order sibling photos you will need to book your sibling photo session by [CLICKING HERE](#) please note that Sibling Photo bookings will close on Friday 28 February at 1.00pm. Ordering instructions for sibling photos will be provided at the photo session.

Uniform expectations for all students are per the grooming standards in our Student Planner, with all students expected to wear their full Summer Uniform (no P.E uniform allowed). Students in Years 7-12 will be required to wear their College blazer. Any student who is determined by College staff to not meet the uniform and grooming requirements will not have their photo taken on 3 March and not be included in class / year level photographs. A 'catch-up' day on Monday 23 March will provide the opportunity for individual photos for students who are either absent or fail to meet the uniform and grooming requirements on 3 March.

Photos taken on the day will be used by the College for Student ID Cards and the College Yearbook, along

with special Year level related folios such as our Year 12 Graduation Folio.



Open Day- 15 March

Marymede's Open Day will be occurring from 11.30am (directly after the Community Mass in the Chapel of The Annunciation) until 2.30pm. While most current parents are likely to have been on a College tour prior to enrolling your child(ren), we encourage you to visit the College on Open Day to see what has changed since then and to explore the opportunities your child may not yet have taken advantage of.

VCE Parent Information Evening

Thank you to the parents that were in attendance last week for our information session. This evening gave us the opportunity to share information regarding the rules around the VCE, important upcoming dates and careers information, as well as advice and tips on how to succeed in the VCE presented by staff. If you were unable to attend, I would ask that you please familiarise yourself with the procedures outlined in our VCE Handbook and support the College in the implementation of these processes should the need arise. This handbook has been emailed to parents and can also be found on the Parent Access Module under Knowledge Banks.

Extended Leave

We know that students learn best when they attend classes with minimal disruption. Within the course of the academic year, it is important that your child attends all their classes to ensure the successful development of concepts, knowledge and skills. We are also aware that at various times throughout the year, some families may plan holidays or extended trips.

Families are discouraged from taking extended leave during the school term as doing so disrupts the learning process and creates gaps in essential knowledge and skills. Families of students studying VCE subjects are especially discouraged from such leave, as extended absences can result in these students being at risk of not meeting outcomes, achieving an N for a unit or multiple units, and potentially not being awarded their VCE.

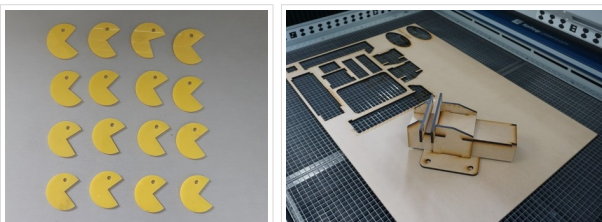

Marymede Has A LASER

The Design and Technology Department at Marymede Catholic College has gone “High Tech”. We are proud to announce the delivery of our brand-new Laser located in the Trade Skills Centre. The laser is an Eplilog Fusion Pro and it has 100 watts of co2 power. The laser is capable of cutting and engraving on both synthetic and organic materials. It can even engrave on glass and anodised aluminium.



Engineering students at Marymede have already started using this advanced manufacturing technology and have cut out their vice (proof of concept) and Year 9 students have cut out their Pac-Man acrylic figures.



So how does it work? Students use Fusion360 CAD software to design their models or individual parts. A DXF file is produced from their model and transferred across to the Eplilog laser software. The laser uses this vector file to cut out the shape via the use of cartesian coordinates in the X & Y plane. Thanks to the wonders of Physics and Mathematics a product is produced.

Please come down to the Trade Skills Centre on our college open day Sunday 15 March - 11.30am to 2.30pm to watch our new laser in operation for yourself.
