# **Grooming & Personal Presentation**

It is my expectation that our students will present themselves well at all times and wear the College uniform with pride and in an acceptable manner. I ask for parental support to ensure that the high grooming standard of our College is maintained.

I would like to mention specifically:

#### **Jewellery:**

Apart from watches and a chain with a small crucifix, no other jewellery is to be worn at school. This includes bracelets, rings etc.

#### **Body Piercings:**

Students may wear one plain earring per ear in the ear lobe (no spacers or dermals). No other objects are permitted in the eyebrow, nose, lip etc.

#### Hair:

Extreme hair styles are not permitted. These include dreadlocks, Mohican style cuts, extreme long or short styles (Level 3 is the minimum hair length). Hair is to be of one natural colouring.

#### Facial Hair:

Boys are expected to be clean shaven at all times.

#### Summer Uniforms Only:

Socks: Boys – Short, blue with stripes Girls – Short blue, plain

#### **Girls Dresses:**

Some of our female students may have grown over the holidays. I ask that you check the length of your dress before returning to school to ensure that it touches the knee.

I ask that parents and students please note that wearing of the blazer is optional in Term 1, however the jumper does not replace the blazer to and from school.

Once again, I ask for parental assistance in these matters. I thank you for supporting us in meeting our grooming expectations.

# DEPUTY PRINCIPAL STAFF AND OPERATIONS PREP – YEAR 12

## Welcome to 2021: both familiar and different

I extend a warm welcome to all families new to our Marymede community and a grateful 'Welcome back' to all returning families. Most of us were glad to see the back of 2020 and its 'unprecedented' nature and as a College we are pleased to be starting 2021 with a calendar that includes many of our regular College events (and some 'catch-up' events postponed from 2020) including those involving our families. While these events have similar nature and names to those in the past, most will be subject to COVID-Safe requirements set by the Victorian Government and the CECV School Operations Guide. # COVID-Safe for 2021

As families would be aware from the continuing COVID clusters over the summer break, we continue to live with COVID-19 and are required to ensure our College remains a safe place for our students and staff. Some of the requirements to start 2021 are:

- Students who are unwell must stay home: The most important action school communities can take to reduce the risk of transmission of coronavirus (COVID-19), is to ensure that any unwell staff and students remain at home and get tested, even with the mildest of symptoms. Parents/carers should also consider getting a medical certificate from the child's treating GP to confirm that it is safe for them to attend school with persistent symptoms that may overlap with some of the symptoms of COVID-19 such as cough or runny nose (e.g. for students who suffer from hay fever).
- Face Masks & Physical distancing: As per the directions of the Victorian Chief Health Officer, the following actions are mandatory:

- Physical distancing should be exercised by parents and school staff at all exit/entry points, bus stops, interchanges and school bus loading areas.

- Face masks to be worn by individuals over the age of 12 when on public transport and school buses – unless you have a lawful exemption.

- Individuals over the age of 12 must carry a face mask at all times.

- Face masks are recommended for use by staff, students and parents when physical distancing of 1.5m cannot be maintained.

Limited Parent entry to campus: Due to the requirements of contact tracing and to reduce the congregation of adults on school grounds, parents of Year 1 – 12 students are not permitted on-campus for school drop-off or pickup. It is therefore very important for parents to clearly communicate with your child exactly where they should meet you for either vehicle or pedestrian pick-up. Pedestrian Gate 3 (near the bus stop) provides the clearest line of sight for primary students needing to locate a parent for pedestrian pick-up.


Parents of Prep students will be directly emailed the instructions for the 'soft start' pick-up and drop-off procedures by Friday 29 January.

• Registration for on-campus events: For College events involving parent attendance onsite – including the upcoming Meet the Teacher and Primary Testing appointments – parents will be required to electronically register for the event and physically sign in upon arrival. Details of the registration will be communicated by each event organiser. All events are also limited by social distancing capacity of 1 person per 2m2.

• Limited car-parking on-campus: The Gate A car park will be open to enable Prep parents (only) to park for Prep drop-off and pick-up. All other parents will need to park off-site.

# Parent Enquiries to Main reception & lateness sign-in at Founders' Building

During most of 2020 the Finance Office also doubled as the Primary Student reception office. For 2021, Student reception for Primary students will re-join Secondary student reception and be located in the Founders' Building. Parents should only enter the Finance Office for finance matters (fee payments, etc). For all other enquiries, parents should seek assistance only at Main Reception (Reception Administration).



Both primary and secondary students who arrive late to school must enter the College via Main reception (Pedestrian Gate 4) and sign in at the Founders' Building. Parents of younger primary students may be permitted to walk their child to the Founders' Building but must first register at Main Reception.

# **Student entry**

Parents and students are reminded that secondary students should not be on the campus prior to 8.00am and primary students should not be on-campus prior to 8.20am.

Senior students who attend the Trade Centre for VET courses should go directly to the Trade Centre from the Williamson's Rd entrance via Pedestrian Gate 1 or 2: students should not enter via the Main reception gate, which is not to be used as a student entrance.



# **Roadworks on Vincent Drive**

The roadworks on Vincent Drive that began prior to Christmas have not yet finished. A section of the road near the secondary vehicle exit gate remains a one-direction single lane, controlled by traffic lights. This does cause delays, so parents are advised to allow extra time in travelling to the College via Vincent Drive until the roadworks are completed.

# Carpark etiquette

As we begin a new year and many return to dropping off and picking up students via the College carparks it is worth revisiting some reminders to ensure the safest use of the College carparks and drop-off zones. We appreciate the frustration of slow-moving traffic and ask parents to focus on the safety of our students, some of whom are too young to have fully developed road sense. For the safety of our staff and students, parents are reminded to please be conscious of the following whenever driving through the College for morning drop-off or afternoon pickup (particularly in the Secondary carpark):

- Respect directions of staff on duty
- Obey 10km/h limits
- Drive only in directions indicated on road and respect indicators of single lane traffic areas



- Only allow your child(ren) to exit or enter the car at marked drop-off bays or while in a marked parking bay
- Do not stop on pedestrian crossings



- Park only in marked bays and do not exit your vehicle
- Do not use areas marked for Staff parking: while they may appear vacant, staff do return from meetings and off-campus professional learning and there are part-time staff who arrive at various times during the day



# Photo Day: Monday 22 February

A reminder to current Marymede families that School photos are scheduled to take place during the school day on Monday 22 February 2021 with sibling photos taking place from 3.30 – 7.00pm. The College will use the services of National Photography who offer value packages and simplified ordering processes for our families. Students will be provided with personalised order forms including ordering and package details in the coming weeks.

Families wishing to arrange sibling photos will need to book your sibling photo session via instructions that will be emailed to families shortly. Please note that Sibling Photo bookings will close by Friday 19 February. Ordering instructions for sibling photos will be provided at the photo session.

Uniform expectations for all students are per the grooming standards in our Student Planner and as provided in the Principal's article above, with all students expected to wear their full Summer Uniform (no P.E uniform allowed). Students in Years 7-12 will be required to wear their College Blazer. Any student who is determined by College staff to not meet the uniform and grooming requirements will not have their photo taken on 22 February and not be included in class / year level photographs. A 'catch-up' day on Monday 22 March will provide the opportunity for individual photos for students who are either absent or fail to meet the uniform and grooming requirements on 22 February.

Photos taken on the day will be used by the College for Student ID Cards and the College Yearbook, along with special Year level related folios such as our Year 12 Graduation Folio.
