## 985 Plenty Road Sewerage Project

March 2021

### Project update

We're continuing work to construct a new sewer along the southern side of Vincent Drive, South Morang.

Unstable ground conditions have slowed our progress and this work has taken longer than expected.

We expect the work to be finished by 30 June 2021.

We're working with the power authority to ensure safety as the work is close to the streetlight foundations - from the Marymede Catholic College's gate on Vincent Drive to the railway reserve.

Comdain, our project partners, will be onsite in late March.



Work will stop for the Easter break from Thursday 1 April and will resume on Tuesday 6 April. Normal working hours are 7am to 5pm, Monday to Friday and from 7am to 1pm on Saturday.

When the new pipeline is finished, it will be connected to the existing network on the northern side of Vincent Drive. This new sewer will support future growth in South Morang.

We apologise for any inconvenience and thank you for your patience as we complete this important work.
