Introduction

In this booklet, you and your parent/s can draft subject preferences before inputting final selections into the Web Preferences website. Personalised login details and instructions will be emailed to you in Term 3. Carefully read all instructions before finalising your selections. One receipt must be printed, signed and returned via email to Student Reception (Jenny.Priest@marymede.vic.edu.au) by **7th August**.

From the preferences received, next year's timetable and subject blocks will be determined. Any late returns or subsequent change of preferences can only be accommodated if the timetable allows.

You are asked to consider your selections carefully. Every effort is made to give students their top preferences, however as student selections are the sole basis on whether a subject will or won't run for the following year, not all offerings may result in a class going ahead next year.

Occasionally, a student may not receive all their choices however, every effort is made to minimise any clashes. Therefore, each student's choice and order of reserve preferences is important.

Students will be notified once timetabling has been completed.

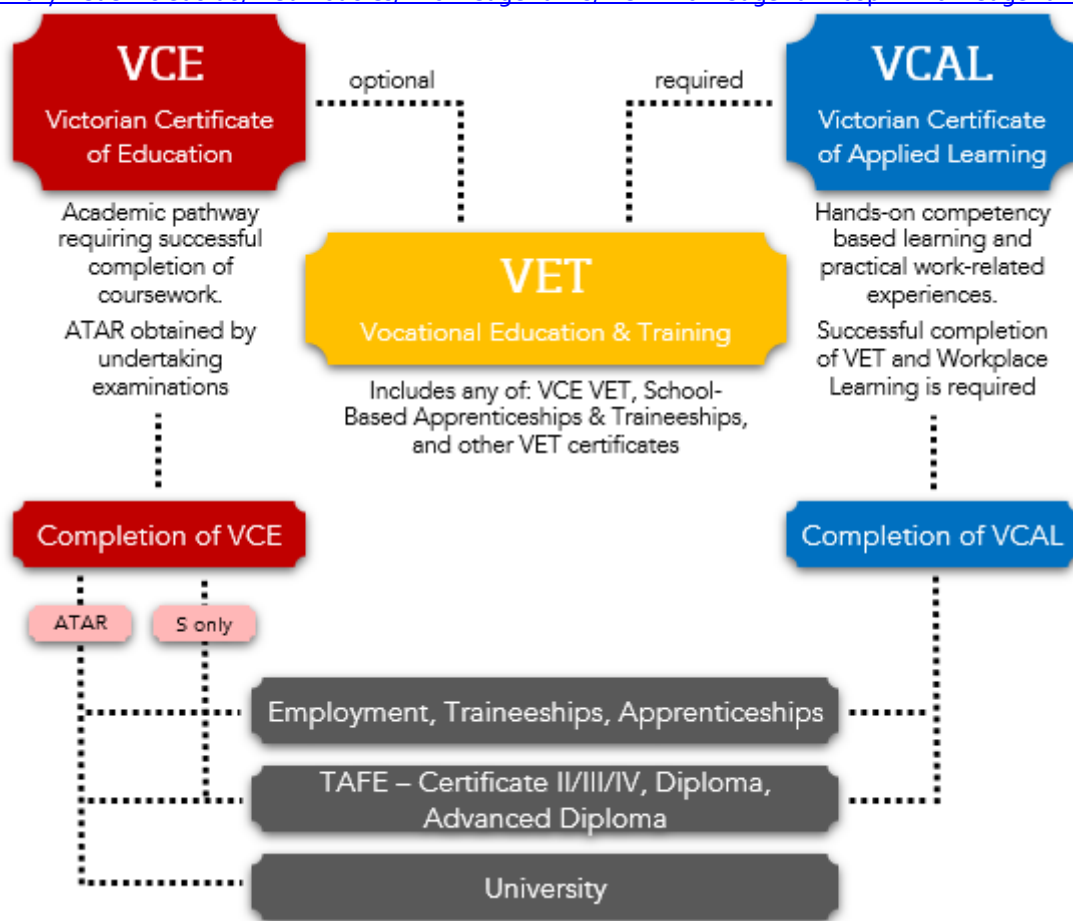

VCE: The Victorian Certificate of Education	VCAL: The Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Comprises of 22 units taken over two years, with satisfactory completion determined by SACs, SATs and Examinations. ➤ Students must complete their SACs, SATs and examinations in order to obtain an ATAR to apply for direct entry to university. ➤ To be awarded their VCE, students must satisfactorily complete a no fewer than 16 units, which must include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 3 units of an English domain study <i>Two of which must be a Units 3 & 4 sequence</i> ▪ 3 sequences of Unit 3 & 4 studies other than the required English study 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Designed for competency-based assessment which does not provide an ATAR. ➤ This hands-on, vocationally oriented option is focused on the development of work related and industry specific skills. ➤ Compulsory study of Literacy, Numeracy, Personal Development and Work-Related strands ➤ The Industry Specific strand is either a VET or School Based Apprenticeship (SBAT). ➤ To be awarded their VCAL, students must satisfactorily complete: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ All compulsory strand units at the award level ▪ VET, if studying at the intermediate and senior award level, including Work Placement
VET: Vocational Education and Training	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ VET qualifications can contribute towards both the VCE and VCAL. ➤ VCAL - VET is mandatory and contributes to VCAL through meeting the requirements of the Industry specific skills and work-related strands. ➤ VCE - VET can either providing a study score through SACs and an exam OR block credit to your ATAR.
