## YEAR 11 CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP RETREAT 2015



This new initiative in 2015 was aimed at giving Year 11 students an understanding of what it means to be leaders in a Catholic school and to enable them reflect on active service of the local, national and global communities as developing 21st century citizens. Students had the opportunity to hear from Mr Kenny about Christian leadership as servant leadership modelled by Jesus Christ and Pope Francis. We also listened to Mr Mark Clarke, Executive Officer, Office of Justice and Peace, Archdiocese of Melbourne, who highlighted the importance of being aware of the difference between justice and equality as future leaders.

Our Year 11 students reflected on their relationship with God:

"I was more open to prayer and realised that a relationship with God can be had in many different ways."

"I learned that God created us for a reason and each person is loved and special."

"Mark Clarke showed us interesting links between our relationship with God and our daily life experiences."

And on insights gained about Christian leadership and their perceived leadership styles:

"I learned that it takes more to lead people than having confidence."

"Leadership is not just about directing people or having a badge, it is also about leading by example and treating others how you want to be treated."

"A servant leader 'walks' among those who follow them."

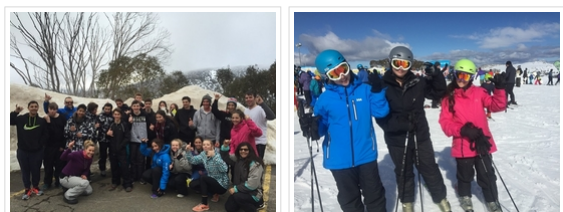

It has been another dynamic term at College in ICT matters. We have seen the implementation of our iPad Program in Years Prep-2. Students are enjoying the use of iPads to enhance their learning. The iPads have a range of Apps preloaded on them via the College network.
