Dear Parents, Students, Staff and Friends of Marymede Catholic College,

"Lent is a fitting time for self-denial; we would do well to ask ourselves what we can give up in order to help and enrich others by our own poverty...**I distrust a charity that costs nothing and does not hurt.**"

• Help the Poor - Don't remain indifferent "In the poor and outcast we see Christ's face; by loving and helping the poor, we love and serve Christ. Our efforts are also directed to ending violations of human dignity, discrimination and abuse in the world, for these are so often the cause of destitution. When power, luxury and money become idols, they take priority over the need for a fair distribution of wealth. Parental Engagement

At Marymede, we are serious about enhancing the academic attainment and wellbeing of all our students. Current research supports the philosophy recognising that students learn more and succeed at higher levels when home, school and community work together and play collaborative, complementary and supportive roles to support learning and development (for example, Epstein and Sheldon 2006).

Parental engagement is a highly significant leverage point for enhancing the academic attainment and wellbeing of children and young people. Ongoing conversations between parents and teachers about both their critical roles in learning secure a student's academic attainment. Research suggests that dialogue between parents and school is needed to keep parents informed about curricula, courses, school rules and assessments which, in turn, enables parents and teachers to work together to support the child in his/her education (Cher and Bowen 2006). This dialogue can lead to conversations about optimal home learning environments, in turn benefitting a child's academic pursuits.

Marymede Catholic College offers multiple forums inviting parental engagement. I urge parents to see the value in engaging in the following:

- Subject Selection Information sessions
- Curriculum Information sessions
- Parent/Teacher/Student Interviews
- Utilising specialist staff in the areas of Careers, VCAL, VCE
- Utilising the Student Welfare and Wellbeing Counsellors and College Psychologist, available to assist at home and school
- Communicating with staff through phone calls, emails, one-to-one meetings and academic monitoring of students' progress

To gain the greatest value from meeting with a staff member, calling ahead to make an appointment is essential. This enables the staff member to prepare and collaborate with you effectively.

One important area for parental engagement is the awareness of homework, its association with high academic attainment, and the need to have supportive monitoring while your son/ daughter develops a focused study regime and pattern. If your child attends class unprepared, he/she is unquestionably falling behind. Therefore, conversations about homework and study should centre on total preparation for any subject's next class, consolidating the content and skills taught, re-reading and reviewing notes. Such conversations invalidate the catchcry: 'I have no homework tonight'. Students in Years 7-8 should be studying and completing homework tasks for 1-1 ½ hours every night; Years 9-10 need to spend 1 ½ -2 hours every night; Years 11-12 need 2-3 hours. A balanced homework and study regime also requires weekend work in order for students to complement and extend the knowledge and skills taught at school.

Parent engagement at Marymede also underpins success through our co-curricular programs such as our Sporting, Music and Performing Arts events. The success and the excellent results our students experience are due largely to the commitment demonstrated by students, teachers and parents working cooperatively.

I encourage parents to continue your investment and engagement into your son's/daughter's education alongside school staff to facilitate a supportive learning environment in both the home and the school.

Year 11 Texts and Traditions – Guest Speaker presentation - Fr Elio Capra

Last Friday our Year 11s were fortunate to hear **Fr Elio Capra**, **a Salesian Priest**, speak about the Bible as a sacred text. Fr Elio took his audience on an engaging journey through Christ's life exploring cities in which Christ spent most of his life as well as asking students about their understanding of God. Fr Elio asked students to describe God in one sentence beginning with: '*To me God is like....*' Some wonderful student responses included that '*God is Love, God is Life*'. Fr Elio then asked our students: 'What did Jesus try to do with regard to the perception of God?' Fr Elio presented students with "The Parable of the Good Samaritan" (Luke 10:25-37) highlighting that in this Parable Jesus provides us with a summary of the central message of all four Gospels regarding how we live out our lives: -

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself." Luke 10:27-28

We were very blessed to leave Fr Elio's presentation with a deeper understanding of The Parable of the Good Samaritan. As Fr Elio stated: 'This story must come alive in our community. When we help the poor in society, we are holding Christ in our hands.'

SECONDARY LEARNING AND TEACHING NEWS

On Friday March 27, your child's **Term One Interim Report** will be uploaded to our Parent Access module (PAM) so that you can have an overview of how your son/daughter has settled in to study this year. Following this will be Parent Student Teacher interviews on Tuesday April 14 from 10am-8.00pm when your family will be able to engage with teachers to discuss your child's progress.

Please access PAM regularly to read daily notices and attendance information. As the year progresses, more student assessment and feedback will be available for you to look view.

A reminder that we expect students to be at school every day of scheduled lessons, except when precluded by illness. Parents wishing to arrange **holidays during term** need to notify the Deputy Principal (Secondary) for authorisation, specifying the time of absence and return dates. Academic achievement is severely compromised by extended absences and Marymede recommends in the strongest of terms that family holidays be limited to school breaks. VCE students away on a holiday when a SAC is scheduled cannot apply for an extension and will not be able to access a grade. They will be required to complete a redemption task upon returning in order to satisfy Unit requirements.

As Marymede continues to expand its **contemporary learning experiences**, all students from Years 7-10 will be making use of the digital resource **Mathspace** in their Mathematics classes. Access is purchased through our text supplier Atlas and it is an essential part of the learning program for all students. Upon paying your fee, Atlast will notify the College and we will provide your child with their access codes. Please ensure you support your child's academic attainment by paying the requisite fee as soon as possible if you have not already done so.
