Subject Selection

For Year 8-11 students, Term 3 is Subject Selection term and students will be provided with extensive resources over the coming weeks to assist them in making important decisions about the subjects they will study in 2017.

While the current Year 11's will have access to Careers counselling as required as they confirm their subjects for Year 12, for each of the other year levels involved in subject selection, there will also be a number of key dates of which students and parents need to be aware. We would strongly encourage all parents to attend to ensure they are aware of all of the options available to students at each of these year levels.

100 Days of School

Next week our 2016 Preps will celebrate reaching their first 100 days of school; this is a significant milestone and a wonderful opportunity for families to reflect on the challenges their child has already faced and conquered, the progress and learning they have achieved, and the wonderful opportunities that lie ahead.

This milestone also offers the opportunity to reflect on the patterns that you and your child have developed over their first 100 days – which ones are working well? And which ones could it be time to change?

In particular, I would encourage families to consider the patterns they have developed around reading regularly and allowing the students' increasing independence.

For families who have already established a pattern of reading most nights, this is a fantastic practice and a great message to your child about the importance placed on their learning and their progress. For those who have struggled to establish this pattern, I would encourage you to chat to the Prep teacher to get support about how to make progress in this area.

Similarly, for those parents already encouraging their child to carry their own bag, to participate in thinking about what they need to take to school, who farewell them at the door of the Prep building and support them in gaining that increased independence, hopefully, you will have already seen the rewards for your child in terms of their resilience and confidence.

Having been a Prep parent myself last year and facing the prospect of being a Prep parent for the second time in 2017, I appreciate the extent to which parents live out their first 100 days of school with their child, wishing for the very best and experiencing every bump in the road so acutely. The 100 days celebration is also a chance to celebrate surviving your first 100 days as a Prep parent.

Work Experience

Just over 40 of our Year 10 students took up the opportunity over the Term 2 break to gain some invaluable work experience. We were very fortunate to have Mrs Carol Fisher, a highly experienced VET Coordinator and Structured Work Placement Coordinator – and good friend to the College – available to make contact with the employers and, where possible, the students themselves during their placement.

Carol reported back that the feedback from employers was very positive about our Year 10's and the way they embraced these new and sometimes challenging experiences. One employer was so impressed by very talented Year 10 student Massimo Gamboni – who assisted in painting a mural at the Rumbles Play Centre in Epping, creating a fantastic picture in the Cheltenham Kids Space and participating in leading a cartoon workshop – that he sent in these fabulous pictures of Massimo's time on his placement. Congratulations to all students for their efforts on their placements.
