## Winners of the Catholic Education Week Religious Art & Writing Competition

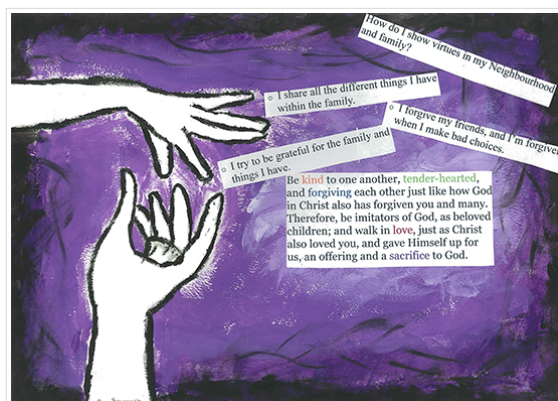

Students took part in various workshops that gave them a glimpse of what it is like to live above and below the poverty line, while trying to meet their basic needs in the areas of food, shelter and education. This proved to be quite difficult for most of the students who were playing the part of those living below the poverty line. We discovered that some sacrifices would have to be made based on priorities, and in many cases, nutrition and health was given a low priority. For most students this experience created an awareness of how fortunate we are to have the resources we rely on, compared to most of the world's population.

The visitors from the Philippines performed a short play that included song and dance. Through these performances, we were able to look at the world through different eyes and begun to share thoughts and understandings of how we can make our world a better place.

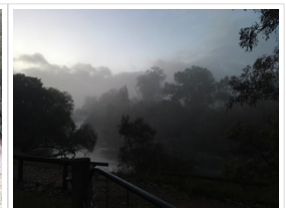
*"Getting along with the group was quite easy, as they were friendly. We supported and encouraged each other throughout the camp."*

Over the course of the day, in individual events Marymede swimmers went on to place 1st in 30 events, 2nd in 23 and 3rd in 12 events. The final 10 events were the freestyle relay and Marymede again dominated in the pool placing 1st in 6 of these relays, 2nd in 3 and 3rd in 1. The following swimmers are also commended for their stand out performances and top placings in year level champions. ### Year 10 Careers Classes

If you have a child in Year 10, hopefully they have shown you their new Marymede Catholic College portfolio. At the end of this year each student should have an up to date careers portfolio that will contain:

- their resume;
- a sample of an application letter;
- Unique Student Identifier (USI), Tax File Number (TFN) and Victoria Student Number (VSN);
- letters of reference and any other qualifications they may have completed;
- a copy of their birth certificate; and
- feedback from employers if they have completed work experience or structured work place learning.

Although work experience is not compulsory as part of their Year 10 Careers class it is highly recommended that every student should investigate getting work experience in an industry of their choice in any of the school holidays. Those students who study a VET program should get a structured work place industry placement associated with the VET they are doing. 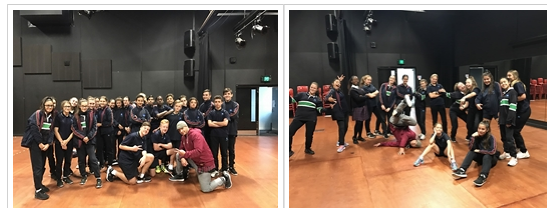
