### Enhancing Catholic School Identity Survey

The Catholic University in Leuven was commissioned by the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria Ltd (CECV) to design a process and tools based on sound research to accomplish the goal of understanding our current Catholic identity and where the school community might like to see it in the future. The ECSI Survey is a key element in this process. The online survey gathers responses from students in Years 5 to 12, all staff and a representative sample of parents.

In the coming week, parents and students will be invited to participate in the ECSI Survey which will assist us in better understanding how our Catholic Identity is expressed in work and practice here at Marymede Catholic College. At no time will any participant be named or identified in the survey; all responses are guaranteed to be anonymous. I look forward to the contribution from our College Community, responses of which will assist us in improving our school.

### Primary College Carpark

I am pleased to be able to inform parents that work will begin after Easter on creating carpark areas in front of the Trade Skills Centre and around the Early Learning Centre. A temporary carpark area will be constructed across the road from the Primary School.

### **Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews**

We will be holding progress interviews for primary and secondary students on March 28 from 4-7pm and April 16 from 1-7pm. There will also be an additional opportunity for interviews for secondary students only, from May 1 from 4-7pm. Please note that March 29 will be a student-free day.

Secondary School Interviews and interviews with Primary Specialist Teachers (eg. Italian) will be held in **The Fitness Centre**. Primary School Interviews with core teachers will be held in **Primary School Classrooms**. A list of room locations will be available on the day of interviews at the Main and Primary Offices as well as on the doors of each Primary House.

15-minute interviews are available with core teachers in primary and 10-minute slots are available with secondary teachers and primary specialists; if there is a need for more time, parents are encouraged to contact teachers to arrange to meet at an alternative time, rather than book multiple slots during the scheduled interview sessions. Similarly, given the limited interview slots available, secondary students who have the same teacher for more than one subject are encouraged to book a single interview slot, rather than multiple slots with the same teacher.

We would strongly encourage students to attend the parent-teacher-student interview, particularly in their upper primary and secondary years in order to part of the conversation about their learning, progress, achievements and areas for development. Please note that they are not required to attend in uniform.

Term 1 **Interim Reports** for both primary and secondary students will be available via our Parent Access Module (PAM) from Wednesday March 28 at 9am. We would encourage all parents to have read this interim report prior to attending Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews.

Bookings for Interviews can be made on-line through the PAM which you can access via the College's website. Bookings can be made online from March 15, 2018 for Primary and Secondary School.

You can access the booking system in the following way:

Full instructions are provided to you after you log on however, please note the following points:

- When you log on, the system displays the names of your child/children. Please make sure you **complete all steps** in the booking process.
- If your child has a teacher for more than one subject, you are able to only book one timeslot.
- When you have made your bookings, you can **print a summary of your bookings** in time order.
- Please ensure that **the time settings on your home computer are correct** as if they are not then you will not see the accurate times when you make a booking.
- Please ensure that you select **SAVE** as you are making your bookings.
- Other parents may be making bookings at the same time that you are using the system. It is possible, though unlikely, that a timeslot will be displayed to you as available, but it is then booked by another parent shortly afterwards. If you then attempt to book this timeslot it will not be available, and a message will be displayed to indicate this.
- If you do not have internet access or if you encounter any problems using the system, please notify the College's Main Reception on 9407-9000 or the IT Helpdesk on helpdesk@marymede.vic.edu.au.

## STUDENT WELLBEING

### Wellbeing Element: Exercise and Health

Wellbeing Builder: Self – Calming or Square Breathing

Social-emotional resilience is comprised of optimism and hope for the future, regulating emotions, controlling impulses, thinking flexibly, having empathy, self-belief and building social connectedness. What does each mean to you?

When students experience tense feelings and anxious thoughts about the school, self-belief, self-acceptance and friendship groups, their bodies respond with signals such as:

- tension in their necks and backs
- quickened and shallow breathing
- hot facial flushes
- anxious thoughts flooding through their minds
- disrupted sleep patterns

Teaching them emotional "off ramps," self-calming breathing and other coping strategies enables students to reduce the intensity of negative feelings, boosts their wellbeing and social-emotional resilience. An effective technique for achieving this is Square breathing. They can do it anywhere and anytime they have a spare five minutes, when nobody around them is aware that they are square breathing.

Square refers to the fact that there are four parts to it which they repeat over and over again. Concentrating hard on the four parts distracts students' emotional minds from their pressing issues and puts their rational minds in charge of their thinking. It increases their oxygen intake and blood flow to the brain which promote clarity of thought. Sometimes it is also known as box breathing Concentrating on breathing deeply will release feel good brain chemicals, clear their minds and lessen tension and anxiety.

### Home Task

As a family, read how to do "Square breathing" outlined on pg 34 of the Upper Primary or Secondary Student Planner. Describe two things you will start doing regularly to relax using square breathing.

### Healthy Body, Healthy Mind

Your state of wellbeing and becoming your best you, relies on you being physically and mentally healthy. There are no shortcuts to good sleep, exercise, humour and breakfast. You have to mindfully focus on them using your signature and top supporting strengths.

# **CAMPUS CO-ORDINATOR PREP – YEAR 12**

### Mernda Rail Update

The railway works are moving along quickly, with the laying of rail having started. The works on either side of the railway station will impact on the Marymede community directly in the following ways:

To safely construct the new Marymede Station and pedestrian underpass, temporary footpath diversions and road closures will take place on the following dates from March 2018:

- From 17-18 March, Williamsons Road (east) will be closed to traffic and pedestrians.
- From 19 29 March (6am-6pm), pedestrians will be temporarily re-directed through the underpass via a securely fenced pathway. Access will be restricted to traffic and pedestrians from 6pm-6am.
- From 29 March 15 April, Williamsons Road (east) will be closed to traffic and pedestrians during the Term 1 school holidays.
- From 16 April, pedestrians will be temporarily re-directed around the underpass via a securely fenced pathway from Term 2.

The new pedestrian underpass and drop-off zone will be completed in mid-2018.

### **Traffic Safety**

The College has passed on two written reports from parents of unsafe truck behaviour near the Primary drop-off /pick-up

zone on Williamsons Rd. Truck drivers have been warned that any further identifiable reports made will result in terminating their contract with Mernda Rail. If you notice unsafe behaviour, please note the number plate of the vehicle and report it to the College, this will be followed up. Mill Park police have also been notified by the College of cars double parking at peak drop-off and pick-up times and will be present in the area when possible. Please do not double park.

To reduce congestion:

- 1. Park and walk park your vehicle further away from the College and walk with your children. Be prepared with umbrellas in your vehicle in case of wet weather.
- 2. Drive through the drop-off /pick-up zone to the end, following the directions of staff. This enables traffic to flow from Williamsons Road more readily. Be prompt with disembarkation.
