FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Staff, Students and Friends of our Marymede Community,

This week we have been celebrating Catholic Education Week in Victoria. The theme of the week is 'Growing Young in Christ'.

Our Director of Students (5-8), Mrs Melinda Muir, staff member Miss Celine Tamburrini and a group of Primary and Secondary students will join over 2,000 other students tomorrow in a Mass to be celebrated at St. Patrick's Cathedral. Marymede is first and foremost a Catholic school striving to be true to the Gospel.

Child Abuse

Most of our families would be aware that the verdict against Cardinal George Pell has been made public. There has been widespread discussion in the media and as a family, you may have chatted about the finding.

Our thoughts and prayers are with the survivors of this and all abuse at the hands of the clergy. I am very sad that these crimes have occurred against children, young men, women and vulnerable adults, many of whom are or were people of faith.

Our challenge is to help young people see the works of Jesus, not the men and women who failed us; to know and understand the joy and hope that Catholics share.

Lent

During Lent, I encourage all members of our school community to take time to reflect on Jesus spending 40 days in the desert, where he was tempted by the trappings of the devil. It is this self-reflection and questioning that prepared Jesus for the challenges he faced in his ministry.

Let us use the 40 days of Lent to reflect on how ready we are for our ministry. Unfortunately, we cannot retreat from all of life's distractions for 40 days, but perhaps we can find a small space of silence each day to reflect and pray.

Thank you to those families who were able to join our staff at the House Welcome BBQs over the last fortnight. I hope our parents enjoyed the opportunity to mingle with their children's teachers and other parents in their House.

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL LEARNING AND TEACHING NEWS PREP – YEAR 12

Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews

At the end Term 1 and during the early weeks of Term 2, we will be holding progress interviews for primary and secondary students. The interviews provide an invaluable opportunity to discuss your child's learning, progress, achievements and areas for development. The interviews will be scheduled on:

4 April from 2.30-8pm (Prep-12)

24 April from 4-7pm (Prep -12)

1 May from 4-7pm (7-12 only)

Please note that **students should attend school on April 4;** however, there will be an early finish with classes concluding at 1.30pm to accommodate the extended interviews. Friday April 5 will be a student-free day.

Secondary School Interviews and interviews with Primary Specialist Teachers (eg. Italian) will be held in **The Fitness Centre**. Primary School Interviews with core teachers will be held in **Primary School Classrooms**. A list of room locations will be available on the day of interviews at the Main and Primary Offices as well as on the doors of each Primary House.

15-minute interviews are available with core teachers in primary and 10-minute slots are available with secondary teachers and primary specialists. If there is a need for more time, parents are encouraged to contact teachers to arrange to meet at an alternative time, rather than book multiple slots during the scheduled interview sessions. Similarly, given the limited interview slots available, secondary students who have the same teacher for more than one subject are encouraged to book a single interview slot, rather than multiple slots with the same teacher.

We would strongly encourage students to attend the parent-teacher-student interview, particularly in their upper primary and secondary years in order to part of the conversation. Please note that they are not required to attend in uniform.

Bookings for Interviews will open on March 21 via PAM (accessible via the College website). Further instructions on how to book interviews will be sent out to families shortly.

Student Absentee Housekeeping

When your child is going to be absent from school, is arriving late or leaving early, parents/guardians are reminded of the following process:

- Ring the absentee line on 9407 9090 and leave a clear voicemail with your child's full name, year level and House, together with the reason for the absence. Parents/guardians can also send an email to absentees@marymede.vic.edu.au with your child's name, date of absence and the reason for the absence.
- If your child is going to be late for school, please re-iterate to your child that they **must sign in** at Student Reception where Mrs Jenny Priest and Mrs Leanne Easdon are located.
- If your child is leaving school early, parents/guardians are to write a note and your child will be required to obtain an early leave pass from their Tutor Teacher or House Coordinator. Students **must sign out** when leaving early and present the early leave pass to Mrs Priest or Mrs Easdon for recording purposes.

Please note that communication of your child's absence/late arrival **must be received no later than 9.30am** on the day of the absence/late arrival. If you do not communicate your child's absence/late arrival by 9.30am and your child does not sign in upon his/her arrival you will receive an SMS message advising that your child is absent and requesting you to call the school to confirm the absence/late arrival.

Knit-A-Square Is Back For 2019

The Square Knit Circle is extremely excited to be regrouping for 2019 to carry on the tremendous work we have been conducting since 2011.

In November last year, our 800+ knitted squares were packed into water-tight shipping envelopes, sent to Kascare's branch in South Africa and stitched into lovely blankets. The Marymede community contributed enough squares to warm children in the South Africa who would otherwise have been freezing. We feel extremely proud that our small contribution will become wonderful blankets, used to keep orphaned, abandoned or children with AIDS, warm.



Where To From Here

Knitting club is every Wednesday lunch time, we hope to regroup bigger and better. Students are currently being sought to learn to knit or crochet 20cm squares that will be sent Zimbabwe, officially the poorest country in the World and Kascare's expanding branch.

With nearly 1,000,000 orphans alive in 2009, Zimbabwe has the highest number of orphans, in proportion to its population, than any other country in the world, according to UNICEF. As many as one in four children in Zimbabwe are orphaned as a result of parents dying from AIDS.
