DEPUTY PRINCIPAL LEARNING AND TEACHING NEWS PREP – YEAR 12

National Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)

Each year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination* Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. Student's Personal Learning Achievements – Term 1 Reflection

The end of Term 1 brings an opportunity for students to pause and reflect on their achievements over the past 10 weeks. Parents are strongly encouraged to review each child's mid-semester report with them, and to celebrate student's areas of strength, as well as discuss areas for improvement. The Mid-Semester Reports are now available via the Parent Access Module (PAM) on SIMON.

Parent/Teacher/Student (PTS) interviews provide a great opportunity for a three-way conversation between parents, teachers and students. It is highly recommended that students attend these interviews with their parent/guardian. This semester interview sessions for Prep – 12 are being held on April 4 & 24, with an addition session for Years 7 – 12 on May 1. Parents are encouraged to book now via PAM to secure their interview times.

For the beginning of Term 2, all Year 7 – 12 students should have a set specific, measurable, action-oriented, relevant, time-bound goals. These should have arisen from student's honest reflection of their achievements from Term 1. Goals may be subject related, for example 'to contribute at least once to each class discussion in Humanities in Term 2'; or more general, for example 'to use a lifestyle planner which has set times each day for homework and study, to assist with completing set tasks before the due date this term'. Setting goals and regularly reviewing them often provides students with a sense of purpose.

All Year 4 – 6 students will have a Seesaw for Schools digital portfolio from the beginning of Term 2. The purpose of these portfolios is that they will be with students during their primary years, showing student's progress over time, building a record of their learning.
