DEPUTY PRINCIPAL STAFF AND OPERATIONS PREP – YEAR 12

Update to COVID-safe measures

We are pleased to welcome back parents on-campus for the start of this term and pray that Victoria's current COVIDsafe measures keep us open and safe. In accordance with the latest School Operations Guide (released 9 July), the following measures are in place to protect our College and Community:

- All visitors (including parents) who enter a building must register at Main Reception or Finance using the QR code. A COVID-Check-in Marshall is required to verify the completion of the QR-code check-in.
- All staff, Secondary students, and visitors (including parents) who enter a building must wear a face mask (unless they have a lawful exemption). Staff may remove their masks when in the act of teaching.
- Spectators are not permitted at interschool sporting events.
- All students using public transport are required to check-in using the QR code; all Secondary school students are also required to wear a face mask when using any school bus or public transport.
- Secondary students attending any off-site activities (e.g., excursion, work placement or external VET studies) must wear a face mask at the external venue.
- A density limit of 1 person per 2m2 will be observed in all areas accessed by visitors. This includes Community Mass in the Chapel.
- Parents and carers are reminded that if the 1.5m social distancing cannot be maintained when outdoors they should be wearing a face mask.

The most important action school communities can take to reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19 is to ensure that any unwell staff and students remain at home and get tested, even with the mildest of symptoms. As noted in a recent article in The Age, the symptoms for the Delta strain of COVID-19 differ from previous strains:

- The most commons signs for those fully and partially vaccinated included a headache, runny nose, and sneezing, followed by a sore throat. For those not vaccinated, it also included fever.
- Burnet Institute epidemiologist Michael Toole said ...
 "In winter, we're all used to having a runny nose, a
 cold. But now, people should all be aware that a
 runny nose may not be the common cold; it may be
 COVID"

Parents and carers eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine are also urged to follow the lead of the many Marymede staff who have received either the AstraZeneca or the Pfizer vaccine.

Primary Inquiry Term 3

Our concept for inquiry this term is Discovery. Students will immerse themselves in scientific thinking with our junior primary students investigating uses of different materials and considering light and shadow using puppets.

Our Year 3 and 4 students will explore forces, whilst Year 5 and 6's experiment with states of matter, circuits and our solar system. Inquiry is designed to challenge student thinking and promote curiosity in their learning as they explore other learning areas. Students are fortunate to have access to both our Digi Tech space and Science labs which we are sure will enrich their learning throughout this term.

VCE/VET/VCAL Parent Teacher Interviews

Parent Teacher interviews for students in VCE, VET and VCAL will be held virtually on Thursday 22 July. These important conversations provide an opportunity to reflect on the past semester and discuss strategies and goals for the upcoming term to ensure that your son or daughter are working to their potential.
