Current face mask requirements

While we are all relieved to be breathing more freely without compulsory face masks, there are still certain requirements for all secondary students and adults regarding face masks:

- Secondary school students and all adults are required by government regulations to carry a face mask with them at all times.
- Face masks are still required on all school buses and public transport: this includes excursions and travel to sports matches and camps. Students may be prevented from boarding school buses – even for sports and excursions – if they do not have a face mask (or a known lawful exemption).

Parent access to the campus

The College has numerous pedestrian gates open for student entry each morning and exit each night, each clearly labelled that these are student entry points only. Parents who have a legitimate reason to enter the property must only do so via Main Reception. Due to both COVID-safe requirements to register those on the property and the Child Protection regulations, all

parents / guardians and visitors must be registered via this process.

Should parents wish to speak with your child's teacher or another staff member, it is always advisable to call the College or email the teacher to book an appointment to ensure the staff member will be available to speak with you.

Photo 'catch-up' day: Monday 22 March

A school photo 'catch-up' day will be held on the morning of Monday 22 March for students who were absent on 22 February or unable to have their photo taken due to uniform or grooming issues. Families who missed out on sibling photo bookings will also be provided an opportunity for these to take place on that same morning (during school hours). The College will again use the services of National Photography: instructions for ordering photos will be provided at the photo session.

Uniform expectations for all students are per the grooming standards in our Student Planner and as provided in the Principal's Newsletter of 21 January, with all students expected to wear their full Summer Uniform (no P.E. uniform allowed). Students in Years 7-12 will be required to wear their College Blazer. Any student who is determined by College staff to not meet the uniform and grooming requirements will not have their individual photo taken.

Photos taken on the day will be used by the College for Student ID Cards and the College Yearbook, along with special Year level related folios such as our Year 12 Graduation Folio.

All families should now be familiar with our online learning management system, SIMON. The SIMON Parent Access Module (PAM) provides the opportunity for both students and parents to engage with the classroom learning.

SIMON provides an important opportunity for students, parents and teachers to work together to achieve successful learning outcomes for our students. This is an opportune time to log into PAM and review any assessment results that your son/ daughter has received this term. Future assessment dates will be accessible on PAM so you can assist your child to planning their study time and adequately preparing for their tasks.

Teachers may communicate via letters generated in PAM are the main method of communication by teachers to notify parents of assessment results that were not submitted to an acceptable standard. Please ensure you login regularly and have your most frequently checked email as your verified contact.

Seasons for Growth® Program: Learning to live with change and loss



Each child in the Primary school received an invitation to participate in the Seasons for Growth Program.

There has been an enormous response to this invitation therefore the number of groups we can offer will need to be prioritised.

Some clarification regarding the program:

This is only for students who have experienced changes such as death, separation, divorce, and significant changes such as moving schools and the related circumstances. If there has been a death it is recommended that 6 months has passed since this experience. This free of cost and will occur during the school day. A Parent information session will be held for those students who are participating.

This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research which highlights the importance of social support and the need the practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem-solving, decision-making, effective communication and support networks.

If you think your child would benefit from Seasons for Growth and they meet the criteria above we would encourage you to talk to them about participating in the program. Each student's family will receive an invitation for their child to participate via Operoo with more details about the Seasons for Growth program.

If this is not relevant to your family's situation, please decline the Operoo invitation.


