# FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Staff, Students and Friends of our Marymede Community,

It is wonderful to have our Preps and Years 1 and 2 students back on campus this week. The buildings have come alive once more and new energies have burst into life in all directions.

I am delighted that the State Government have pushed forward some other year levels returning to school.

Years 5 and 6 students are able to return tomorrow, Friday 22 October. They will learn remotely Monday 25 October to Wednesday 27 October before returning onsite on Thursday 28 and Friday 29 October.

Years 7 and 11 students will return on Friday 22 October and remain onsite full-time.

Year 10 students will return to school this Friday 22 October. They will learn remotely Monday 25 to Wednesday 27 October before returning onsite on Thursday 28 and Friday 29 October.

Year levels Prep, 1, 2, 3, 4, 8 and 9 will stay on the previously published schedule.

A full return for all of our students is expected early in November.

### **Senior Students**

Our Unit 3/4 students were able to return on campus last Thursday 15 October to connect again with their peers and their teachers. The College had to wait until the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) gave us the clearance for this to happen after one of our Year 12 students tested COVID positive the previous week.

There is no doubt that this has been a challenging time for our senior students and their parents with the final exams now less than one week away. I again ask our Marymede Community to keep these students in our prayers over the next four weeks.

### Farewell To Our Year 12 Students

We delayed the College's farewell to our Year 12 students until yesterday to allow all of the cohort the opportunity to be on campus. In the afternoon the students gathered online in their Tutor Groups to say their goodbyes to the staff and students. We then had an enjoyable outdoor lunch in Wurun Common with the Year 12 students appropriately distanced. The students appeared to enjoy the opportunity to mix with their peers and their teachers one last time on the school grounds.

The College is planning a final Year 12 Celebration with the students and hopefully parents at an outside venue after the exams. We are waiting on Government advice as to what we will be allowed for a gathering of up to 500 people.

## DEPUTY PRINCIPAL STAFF AND OPERATIONS PREP – YEAR 12

### Pop-up vaccination clinic at Marymede: 22 October & 19 November

The main reason our state has been able to accelerate the 'roadmap' to a COVID-normal life is the vaccination rate across Victoria increasing significantly over the last month. Across the state we have now reached 90% first-vaccination rate and at Marymede, 100% of staff and over 90% of Year 12 students have now received at least one vaccination.

To assist families who have as yet been unable to book a vaccination, Marymede Catholic College is pleased to be partnering with a local medical provider to offer families the choice to receive a COVID vaccination. As indicated in previous College communications, the choice to be vaccinated is a family choice: this opportunity is purely voluntary and will require parental consent for all minors.

From 8.30am - 10.30am on Friday 22 October and 8.30am - 1.30pm on Friday 19 November, a clinic will be set up in the Marymede Fitness Centre for trained nurses to deliver the Moderna vaccine (privacy screens will be in place).

This opportunity will be open to all Marymede family members: students over 12 years of age (with parental consent), older siblings and parents. Families will be able to book an appointment together and there will be vaccination advice, opportunity to ask questions and screening prior to delivering any vaccination. Students may attend their vaccination without a parent/carer if at least one parent / carer fills in the following consent forms:

Bookings are made on a per-family basis. i.e. only one booking per family is required. Please use the following link (via PAM) to make your Moderna vaccination booking.

BOOKING YOUR VACCINATION via PAM: After logging in to PAM, select 'Parent Teacher Interviews', then click on one of your children. Next, select 'Online Vaccination Booking' (may be at base of screen below PSG). Finally, select Tutor Group and select your desired timeslot (only one time per family is required).

There are still available timeslots for both 19 October and 22 November.

### A safe return to onsite learning

It was a delight to welcome back Prep & Year 1-2 students this week. Thanks to the great response of Victorians in the uptake of vaccination, from Friday 22 October all year levels return at least part-time. The acceleration in vaccination rates also means that all students are likely to be back full-time from Wednesday 3 November.

Recent success in managing an infectious COVID case at the GAT (who tested positive the next day) highlights the importance of combined measures to keep students and staff safe at school:

1. Face Masks

- 2. Social distancing
- 3. Ventilation
- 4. Vaccination

Parents can support the health of our community through supporting the COVID-safe measures the school has in place, and by ensuring that if your child has any of the symptoms below, that they stay home and receive a COVID test:

- loss or change in sense of smell or taste
- fever
- chills or sweats
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath
- runny nose ٠

The results of the COVID test should be sent to nurse@marymede.vic.edu.au prior to your child returning to school.

Ongoing measures the school is taking to keep your children safe include:

- Wearing of face masks
  - All staff, all adults and all Secondary students are required to wear a face mask at all times.

- Year 3 - 6 students are required to wear a face mask indoors at all times

- Prep - Year 2 students are also strongly encouraged to wear a face mask when indoors. - Parents and carers conducting drop-off and pick-up are also required to wear a face mask at all times

- All parent & guardian access to the campus is restricted and all parent involvement with activities on-campus is cancelled for the foreseeable future.
- Parents and visitors may only enter a school building if they show proof of vaccination and QR code registration
- Extended and increased cleaning arrangements are already in place and will continue.
- No eating is permitted indoors
- Staff are encouraged to open windows whenever the weather suits and all air-conditioners are used on the 'fresh air' cycle only.
- Air purifiers have been installed into all primary and Year 7 classrooms, the exam centres, many secondary classrooms and any other spaces with limited ventilation.
- Teachers will be instructed to separate student desks wherever possible to enable social distancing.
- Hand sanitizer is available at the entrance to every building and posters advising students how to maintain good hygiene practices and effective hand washing are posted throughout the school an all bathrooms.

- All staff and contractors are required to have received at least one vaccination
- Staff and students are being kept in 'bubbles' as much as possible
- In addition to the normal cleaning activity, there is progressive cleaning throughout the day to ensure that risks of transmission are reduced for high-touch surfaces

We thank parents and carers for your continuing support and understanding of the measures taken to protect all community members.

Examination revision guides will be distributed to parents and students next Friday 29 October and should be used to assist in the preparation for the upcoming examinations. Teachers will be working closely with students to provide structured, guided revision and continue to build their study strategies and revision techniques. The examination timetable will be available within the revision guide and students are only required to attend the College when they have an examination scheduled.

You may have read in the media about a popular show call Squid Game which sounds like a children's show, but it is a highly violent Adults Only program.

Unfortunately, we are aware that Primary students have accessed and watched these violent shows and they can then re-enact them on the playground. It can be difficult keeping across all of the latest trends so Common Sense Media is a fantastic website for parents to find up to date information about all kinds of media that your children may be viewing.
