COVIDsafe measures & thanks

Last Monday, we again had to enact isolation procedures for Primary Close Contacts (Tier 1) within our community upon being informed of COVID-positive cases who had been on-campus and are grateful to the many staff who assisted students and parents in this smooth process and to the parents who then had to collect their children at short notice.

There have been media reports about the introduction of new quarantine procedures for returning unvaccinated students to school after 7 days through the use of Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT). Details of the process will be communicated to parents to whom this option will apply should a future case affect students at school. Importantly, the government and MACS have confirmed that this process only applies when the COVID exposure is at school: if the exposure is from a case in the home or the community, then the RAT procedures do not apply. Parents should also note that PCR testing is still required on Days 2, 6 & 13 for students eligible for Rapid Antigen Testing: the RAT testing enables unvaccinated and partially vaccinated students to be safely monitored to attend school from Day 8. The test kits will be supplied to the College to distribute to parents of affected students only when a new case is present at school. While we hope to not have to use any quarantine procedures, we look forward to this new ability to limit the impact on schooling of future possible COVID cases.

Parents can continue to support the health of our community through supporting the COVIDsafe measures the school has in place, and by ensuring that if your child has any of the symptoms below, that they stay home and receive a PCR COVID test:

- loss or change in sense of smell or taste
- fever
- chills or sweats
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath
- runny nose

The results of the PCR COVID test should be sent to nurse@marymede.vic.edu.au prior to your child returning to school. Parents / carers of any students isolating as Primary Close Contact / Tier 1 exposure should also email their Day 13 negative PCR test result (or Day 6, if fully vaccinated) prior to your child returning to school. Please note that Rapid Antigen Test are not valid for release from quarantine.

Parents are also reminded that if entering a school building, all parents and visitors are required to use the QR code and to show their vaccination status to the relevant staff (only vaccinated adults are permitted to enter school buildings).



A COVID-normal return to school activities

The School Operations Guide (9 November) now permits resumption of year level assemblies, liturgies, incursions, excursions, camps, co-curricular activities and more – such as the Book Week Parade on 23 November – all with COVIDsafe measures in place. Many of these activities have already resumed, to the delight of students and staff. This will include an abridged performance of our middle-years production of Moana Jr that will have a live student-only audience on 9 December. Parents and carers will receive communications about these events in coming weeks, including plans for making available a video of the Moana Jr performance for families.

Due to the density requirements, the traditional Celebrations of Learning and Secondary Awards evenings will be in-school events only, to be streamed for families at home (as occurred in 2020). At present, these are planned for:

Next year the College is required to conduct NAPLAN online and this readiness test is a requirement from VCAA to ensure our systems and computer infrastructure are effective. There are no results shared with the school or parents, it is purely for systems testing.

Examinations

2022 Commencement Classes

Students in Year 9 who will be studying a VCE subject as part of their 2022 Year 10 program will fully participate in the program this year.

All students are expected to attend the entire VCE commencement program as it will help students to start 2022 on the right foot. Critical VCE/Careers information and wellbeing sessions will also be included as part of the program, as well as the Year 10 City excursion and Year 11 Retreat Day. Teachers will communicate holiday homework to students throughout the program. Parents are encouraged to discuss the Commencement Program with your son or daughter to ensure they are feeling supported in a key transition within their secondary education journey.
