- Experience in diagnosing and tailoring recommendations for students with learning difficulties and Specific Learning Disorders.

Key duties and responsibilities

- Provide high quality, cognitive-educational assessments for students with learning difficulties, who have not responded to previous intervention.
- Following a comprehensive assessment, and where appropriate diagnose Specific Learning Disorders.
- Provide psycho-social and psychometric assessments to identify students with symptoms of developmental concerns (i.e., Autism Spectrum Disorder, ADHD) and refer to external supports for further assessment.
- Tailor individual learning strategies for students.
- Write comprehensive assessment reports within an appropriate timeframe.
- Conduct meetings with parents to collect sensitive child developmental history.
- Provide parents with assessment feedback and recommendations.
- Provide consultation to Learning Diversity Leaders in developing and implementing learning support strategies.
- Provide short-term counselling support to students, as required.
- Meet regularly with Director of Counselling P-12 to discuss student case load.
- Attend and actively contribute to weekly Counselling Team meetings.
- Supervise the secondary student Wellbeing Space as required.
- Engage in regular clinical supervision and professional development opportunities.
- Respond to students at risk and effectively plan for student safety.
- Maintain clear and coherent electronic case notes in clinical systems (i.e., Halaxy).
- Establish positive partnerships with external agencies, school networks and allied health professionals.
- Actively facilitate groups and programs that support the social and emotional development of students.

- Attend college open days, information evenings, camps, and staff conferences, as required.
- Carry out any other relevant, additional duties as directed by the Director of Counselling.

Key selection criteria

- Possess the skills, experience and qualifications to perform the duties and responsibilities of the position
- Excellent interpersonal, communication and negotiation skills
- Ability to handle sensitive and confidential information appropriately
- Ability to have a positive influence on the culture of the College through a collaborative and curious disposition
- Ability to contribute to the broad strategic intent of the College
- Ability to set and monitor high standards of communication
- Proven experience in conducting cognitive-educational assessments
- Prove experience working with children and adolescents and their families in an educational or alternate setting.
- Commitment to supporting the Catholic Identity of the College
- Commitment to and understanding of child protection and child safety issues in schools
- Commitment to safe work practices
- Commitment to professional learning and development
- Commitment to the implementation of College policies and procedures
